How to be sustainable this holiday season

Go green this season and enter the New Year knowing you did something for the planet. Here are sustainable tips from Sustainability Council members:

Dr. John Ruppert, Biology: "Buy experiences or give your time rather than goods. Take someone out to dinner or a coffee to share some time with them, go see a show together (they come at all price points). A sustainable lifestyle includes slowing down and in many ways is better for not only 'the world' but ourselves."

Dr. Laura Twersky, Biology: "See tips for hosting a holiday get-together sustainably at the <u>Natural Resources Defense Council."</u>

Dr. Eileen Poiani, Chair of the Sustainability Council/ Mathematics: "Give Memberships to environmentally-conscious organizations such as Arbor Day Foundation, Audubon Society, The Nature Conservancy and the Wildlife Conservation Society."

Georgia Kral, Communication & Media Culture/ Director of Student Media: "Look for ways to cut down on your use of plastic, paper and other materials. For example, wrap gifts in newspapers instead of buying new wrapping paper. If you attend a holiday party with single use plates and cups hold on to yours for the entirety of the event so you don't need to use more than one. Oh, and recycle your Christmas tree. Most townships in New Jersey offer tree pickup, and most of the time the trees are chipped and reused locally as mulch. Important: trees with tinsel, lights, ornaments and stands will most likely not be picked up."

Noelle Sprenkle, Junior: "Buy gifts from small/local businesses. Use timers to avoid outdoor lights being left on too long. Look into the brands you support this holiday season and choose to purchase from companies with more sustainable practices."


