# Saint Peter's University receives two awards for sustainability

Saint Peter's University recently received two awards for its accomplishments in educating about sustainability and implementing sustainable practices at the university, which were led by the Sustainability Council.

In September at the 2023 NYC Green School Conference, Saint Peter's received the **International Green University Award** "in recognition of its outstanding contribution towards fostering a culture of environmental responsibility within the academic community and accepting accountability to the pupils and responsibility to the planet." The award was presented by Green Mentors, which has a Special Consultative Status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations.

The conference took place during the 78<sup>th</sup> session of the UN General Assembly and focused on the global discourse about sustainability and environmental education. At the conference, Dr. Eileen L. Poiani, Chair of the Sustainability Council, gave an invited presentation entitled *Energizing the Earth through Education*, showcasing sustainability programs at Saint Peter's that relate to "care for our common home."

"Microplastic Menace" is a presentation by biology students and Dr. Laura Twersky on the effects of microplastics on wildlife and humans. Students will talk about their research on MPs using the model organism, *Xenopus laevis* (clawed frog). Dr. Twersky's students first presented this research on microplastic effects at a Conservation Science meeting at the American Museum of Natural History in early October.

#### **Updates from our very own Cura Farms**



Did you know that there's a farm on campus? <u>Cura Farms</u>, located on the first floor of the Mac Mahon Student Center, has been growing lettuce, tomatoes and herbs for nearly a year—this January marks a full year of harvesting food. So far the farm has grown and donated 160 pounds of leafy greens to the campus kitchen and dining services for special events.

CURA (center for urban research in agriculture) utilizes what's called "tower gardening," which is a state-of-the-art vertical aeroponic growing system. Next time you're at the Nest, peek through

the glass windows into the hydroponic farm and you'll see a group of towers, each connected to a water supply line that pumps nutrient-filled water into the reservoirs at the base of each tower. LED lights are another crucial component of the towers, providing the light plants need to grow.

The lab, which also employs 9 student workers, was built using funds from the PODER grant. For more information, see this <u>article in the Saint Peter's Tribune</u>.
