Costa Rica 2024: Turtles, camping & more!

Over the winter break, Dr. Brandy Garrett-Kluthe, associate professor of biology, led a group of students on a travel abroad trip to Costa Rica. On the trip students worked with two different non-profits, both founded and run by Costa Rican women: the Apami Wildlife Rescue Center and the Verdiazul Turtle Hatchery. They visited the Rincon de la Vieja and Arenal volcanoes as well as two mangrove habitats and five beaches. They also slept in tents!

Michele Peralta, a senior computer science and anthropology major called the trip "amazing."

"My favorite part was visiting Don Jorge's farm in the Rincon de la Vieja area. It's a native family-owned organic farm where we learned about plants and wildlife and even got to see how coffee and chocolate are made," she said. "It was incredible to see our favorite products being made right before our eyes."

Garrett-Kluthe plans to bring students back to Costa Rica in the future. Stay tuned.
