Richard J. Jackson, M.D., '69

Dr. Jackson is professor emeritus at the Fielding School of Public Health at the University of California, Los Angeles, where he was department chair in Environmental Health Science. A pediatrician, he has served in many leadership positions with the California Health Department, including the highest as the State Health Officer. For nine years he was director of the CDC's National Center for Environmental Health and received the Presidential Distinguished Service Award. In October 2011, he was elected to the National Academy of Medicine of the National Academy of Sciences and since 2019 he has been co-lead of the NAM's Health and Climate Interest Group.
